Reporting Period: July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018

CONNECTICUT

PURPOSE: Our purpose is to provide adult learners with the requisite skills necessary to become full partners in the educational development of their children and to transition to and complete a postsecondary program.

EMPLOYER SKILL NEEDS: By 2020, 70% of all jobs in Connecticut will require some level of postsecondary education. It is projected that, by 2020, an estimated 127,000 of the job openings in Connecticut will require “some college/no degree,” while an estimated 337,000 job openings will require an associate’s degree or better.

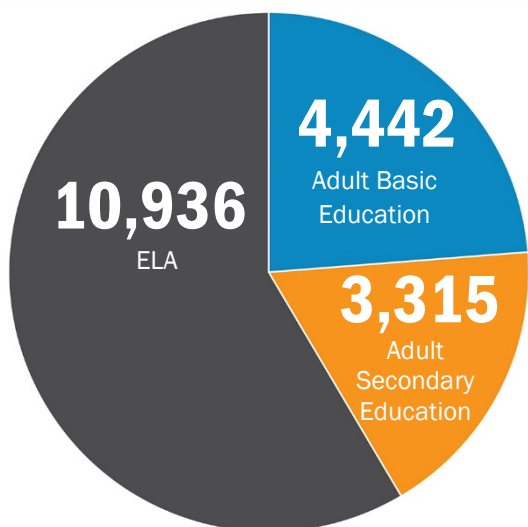

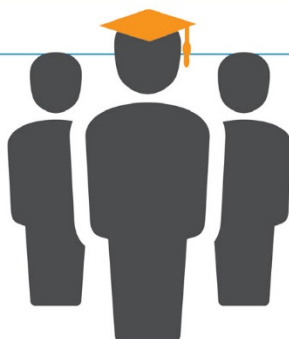
