One of the strategies to fix this issue is to leverage underutilized populations and help reinforce the workforce from within. One large portion are those who do not have a HSE. We need to educate these folks so they can more readily obtain employment, obtain better employment, and/or move on to postsecondary training/education.

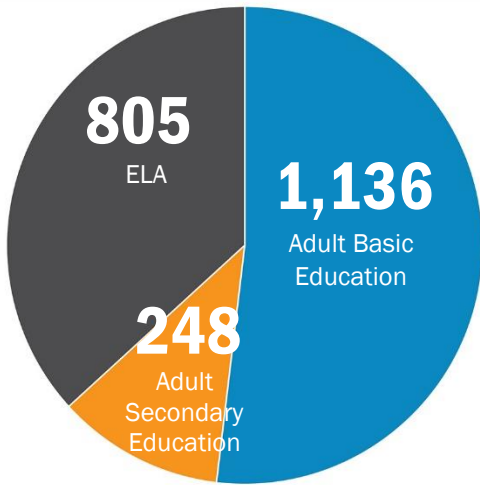

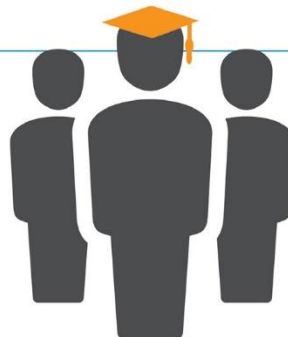
