# OHIO

**PURPOSE:** To increase the number of highly trained and educated individuals in the workforce.

**EMPLOYER SKILL NEEDS:** By 2020, 64% of Ohio jobs in 2020 will require a postsecondary education. Almost 10% of Ohioans do not have a high school equivalency.

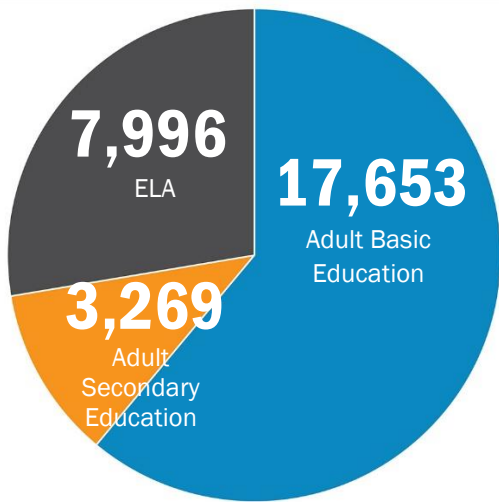

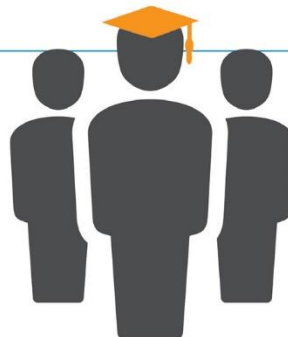
