Purpose: To promote equitable access to high-quality credentialing programs to high-needs, underserved populations and to provide high quality educational and support services that prepare participants for employment in the emerging economy.

Employer Skill Needs: In 2020, 63% of jobs in Pennsylvania will require some postsecondary education. According to the Annual Pennsylvania Economic Survey, conducted by the PA Chamber Foundation, a potential labor shortage of qualified and skilled workers is now cited by most as the single most important issue affecting employers' ability to remain competitive in today's economy.


Our learners have the most barriers to employment and literacy, yet we receive limited funding compared to the \$10,000 per pupil received by elementary education.
